- We advocate in person and through grassroots efforts to represent The Charter when new laws come into consideration: Senate Bill 213, Short Term Rental Ordinance.
- In June, the City of Lone Tree annexed Sweetwater Park. It is now under the jurisdiction of LTPD, but will still be maintained by South Suburban Parks and Recreation. Our neighborhood park is now SAFER than ever. What a great outcome for The Charter!
